# Recreational Vehicles

The Township adopted Zoning Ordinance No. 1361 in January 2020. One of the updates addresses recreational vehicles. The Ordinance allows for one recreational vehicle 25' or less to be parked in a driveway with a permit issued by the Township. The permit is valid from the Sunday before Memorial Day to the Saturday after Labor Day.

# WM Yard Waste Collection

The Township's trash collection contract with Waster Management provides for curbside collection of yard waste on one Wednesday each month from May - August and October and November.

The following Wednesdays are scheduled as collection days for 2022 - May 18, June 15, July 20, August 17, October 19 and November 16.

Residents **must** call 412-784-1784, ext 203 or email <u>WMYardWaste@ohara.pa.us</u> at least **ten (10) days** prior to each scheduled date to request collection. Anyone who fails to notify the Township in time to be put on the list will not qualify for collection that month.

Yard waste includes leaves in biodegradable bags, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, limbs, twigs, brush, tree trimmings and similar material, but *NOT* grass clippings. All tree trimmings and limbs must be cut in lengths less than 48" and limbs must be less than 3" in diameter. All material must be securely bundled and each bundle must weigh less than 40 lbs.

#### Real Estate Tax Rebates

On December 14, 2021 O'Hara Township Council adopted Ordinance No. 1391 establishing a real estate tax rebate program for senior citizens.

If you are age 60 or older, have lived in the Township for ten years or more, have an annual income of less than \$30,000 and your Township real estate taxes increased in 2022, you may be eligible for a real estate tax rebate. The rebate equals 25% of the increase in 2022 Township real estate taxes over 2021 Township real estate taxes.

#### What is Stormwater and Where Does it Go?

Stormwater is rain and melted snow. When not absorbed into the ground it runs off properties: along streets, down storm drains through a complex network of pipes that carry it into local waterways.

Stormwater flows from municipality to municipality until it is finally discharged into a waterway.

The combination of heavy rain and hard surfaces covering our area is resulting in more water making its way into the stormwater system.

# "Community Cat" Information

"Community Cat" is a term used to describe an outdoor, owned or unowned, free-roaming cat. Have you seen a stray or community cat in your neighborhood, and are even feeding it or know someone who is? Although it is a kindness to feed the cat, it is only part of what could be done.

Experts and humane animal rescue organizations agree that one of the best ways to help freeroaming or community cats is through Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) programs. By humanely trapping the cats, neutering/spaying (some programs also offer vaccination) and returning them to their locations, TNR prevents proliferation of cats and allows colonies to gradually shrink.

## Water Deduct Meters

Summer is coming and if you are planning the installation of a swimming pool or a new irrigation system, you may want to consider installing a water deduct meter. This meter will deduct any water usage for these items from the sewer portion of your water and sewer bill. Without a deduct meter, you will be charged sewage fees on all of the water used even if it doesn't go down the sewer.

## License Your Dog

In Pennsylvania all dogs three months or older must be licensed by Jan. 1 of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs.

#### **Reasons for dog licensing:**



- It's the law. All dogs three months and older must have a current license.
- If your dog gets lost, a license is the best way to get them back. A license helps animal control and shelters identify your dog and get them back home safely.
- The cost of a license is less than the penalty for being caught without one. An annual license is \$8.50 and a lifetime license is \$51.50. If the animal is spayed or neutered, the annual fee is \$6.50 and lifetime is \$31.50. Discounts are available to older adults and people with disabilities. Owners who fail to license their dogs could face a fine of up to \$300 for each unlicensed dog.
- License fees support animal control. The annual fee you pay to license your dog helps keep shelters running and supports the work of the Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, which is responsible for ensuring the welfare of dogs, regulating dangerous dogs and overseeing annual licensing and rabies vaccinations.

Dog license applications are simple and only request owner contact information and details about the dog being licensed, including name, age, breed and color. # Hometown Hero Program

#### Veterans' Real Estate Tax Exemption

Pennsylvania residents who are honorably discharged veterans with qualifying disabilities may be exempt from paying real estate taxes "on any building" that serves as the veteran's principal residence with a fiveacre land limit where the building stands. Qualifying disabilities include but may not be limited to the following:

- You must be a 100% service-connected disabled veteran.
- The disability should have occurred during a *war service period*.
- The disabled veteran must also demonstrate the financial need for tax exemption.

#### Selling Your Home?



While your real estate agent and closing company will handle many of the matters related to selling your home, there are some things you can do to make the process easier.

Unpaid taxes can hold up your closing. This includes both real estate tax and earned income tax. If you are not sure if you owe taxes, contact Jordan Tax Services, Inc. at 412-345-7962 for real estate tax information and Keystone Collections Group at 866-539-1100 for earned income tax information.

Make sure all utility bills (phone, water, sewer, electricity, cable, etc.) are current.

Backflow prevention devices must be installed on all waterlines prior to final reading. Depending on where you live in the Township you should contact either Fox Chapel Authority at 412-963-0212 or Hampton Shaler Water Authority at 412-486-4867 for further details.

Township Ordinance No. 1299 requires that a Sanitary Sewer Certificate be obtained prior to the sale or transfer of property.

A Sanitary Sewer Certificate is issued after the Township and a registered plumber perform an inspection verifying that no storm, ground or surface water is directed into the sanitary sewer system. Property owners arrange and pay for a registered plumber to attend the test. The Township witnesses, inspects and certifies the test at a cost of \$100 for residential buildings and \$200 - \$400 for commercial buildings based on square footage.

Once issued, the Certificate is valid for one year from the date of the initial inspection. It is advisable to have the test done early in the sale process, since repairs **must** be made prior to closing.
