Talking Trash FAQ's

Which can is for trash? The black can with the green lid is your new trash container. Bag all trash placed in the can.

Which can is for recycling? The green can with the yellow lid is still your recycling container. **DO NOT** bag recyclables placed in the can.

Can I get additional trash/recycling cans? Additional cans can be ordered for a fee by calling WM at 800-451-3060.

What is a bulk item? Bulk items are furniture, appliances or other items too large for a container.

When is bulk waste collected? ONE bulk item will be collected on your trash collection day during the first full week of each month. Additional items can be collected for a fee by contacting WM at 800-451-3060.

Did the Backdoor, Yard Waste or Household Hazardous Waste program change? No, there have been no changes to any of these programs.

Recreational Fire Permits



This is a reminder to all residents who like to sit around the campfire roasting marshmallows and telling ghost stories. Don't forget to get your recreational fire permit from the Township for 2023. There is no fee for this permit. The form is available at www.ohara.pa.us under Documents & Forms or at the Township office.

WM Yard Waste Collection

The Township's trash collection contract with Waste Management provides for curbside collection of yard waste on one Wednesday each month from May - August and October and November.

The following Wednesdays are scheduled as collection days for 2023 - May 17, June 21, July 19, August 23, October 18 and November 22.

Residents must call 412-784-1784, ext 203 or email WMYardWaste@ohara.pa.us at least ten (10) days prior to each scheduled date to request collection. Anyone who fails to notify the Township in time to be put on the list will not qualify for collection that month.

Yard waste includes leaves in biodegradable bags, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, limbs, twigs, brush, tree trimmings and similar material, but NOT grass clippings. All tree trimmings and limbs must be cut in lengths less than 48" and limbs must be less than 3" in diameter. All material must be securely bundled and each bundle must weigh less than 40 lbs.

Restoration of O'Hara Community Park Hiking Trail



The Township of O'Hara Council is pleased to announce the receipt of two grants to restore the foot bridge over Sycamore Run Creek, part of the hiking trail at O'Hara Township Community Park.

A \$62,500 grant was received from The Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and a \$117,014 grant was received from the Department of Community and Economic Development.

Plans are underway to create a better hiking experience for all!□

Recreational Vehicles

Township Code Chapter 455, Article XIV, Section 14.6.C addresses recreational vehicles in residential areas. The Code allows for one recreational vehicle 25' or less in length to be parked in a driveway with a permit issued by the Township. The permit is valid from the Sunday before Memorial Day to the Saturday after Labor Day.

Spring Stormwater Tips

With the arrival of spring, many of us are looking forward to warmer temperatures, blooming flowers and longer days. But with the change in seasons also comes an increased risk of stormwater runoff. As snow and ice melt and spring rain arrives, it's important to take steps to manage stormwater and prevent flooding and erosion in our community.

Here are some spring stormwater management tips:

Clean out gutters and downspouts. Clear any debris from gutters and downspouts to ensure that rainwater can flow freely away from your home.

Inspect your yard for erosion. As the ground thaws and rain falls, it's important to look for any signs of erosion in your yard. If you notice any areas where soil is washing away, consider installing a rain garden or other form of erosion control to prevent further damage.

Plant native vegetation. Consider adding native trees, shrubs and flowers to your yard to help soak up excess water and prevent runoff.

Limit the use of pesticides and fertilizers. Chemicals used to fertilize lawns and gardens can be carried by rainwater into nearby streams and waterways, causing pollution. Limit the use of these products or consider using organic alternatives.

By taking these simple steps, you can help to manage stormwater and prevent flooding and erosion in our community. Remember, we all have a role to play in protecting our local waterways, and by working together, we can keep our community clean, safe, and healthy.

Water Deduct Meters

Summer is coming and if you are planning the installation of a swimming pool or a new irrigation system, you may want to consider installing a water deduct meter. This meter will deduct any water usage for these items from the sewer portion of your water and sewer bill. Without a deduct meter, you will be charged sewage fees on all of the water used even if it doesn't go down the sewer.

Contact your water company for more information on the installation of the deduct meter. \Box

License Your Dog

In Pennsylvania all dogs three months or older must be licensed by Jan. 1 of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs.

Going Greener

The Township of O'Hara Council has undertaken initiatives to make the Township greener.

The Township is installing three new Level 2 EV car charging stations. One will be at the Municipal Building and two will be in O'Hara Township Community Park. This will make three Level 2 charging stations available for use at the park. The Township also has one Level 2 car charging station at the Lauri Ann West Community Center. A rebate from Driving PA Forward was used to pay in part for the new stations.

Soon you will see Township of O'Hara Chevrolet Bolts being driven by the Township Engineer and Building Inspector. These vehicles will replace two Ford SUV's.

The Township Municipal Building is being converted to all LED lighting through a program from Duquesne Light where we were able to obtain LED fixtures at a much-reduced rate.

Veterans' Real Estate Tax Exemption

Pennsylvania residents who are honorably discharged veterans with qualifying disabilities may be exempt from paying real estate taxes "on any building" that serves as the veteran's principal residence with a five-acre land limit where the building stands. Qualifying disabilities include but may not be limited to the following:

- You must be a 100% service-connected disabled veteran.
- The disability should have occurred during a war service period.
- The disabled veteran must also demonstrate the financial need for tax exemption.

Selling Your Home?



While your real estate agent and closing company will handle many of the matters related to selling your home, there are some things you can do to make the process easier.

Unpaid taxes can hold up your closing. This includes both real estate tax and earned income tax. If you are not sure if you owe taxes, contact Jordan Tax Services, Inc. at 412-345-7962 for real estate tax information and Keystone Collections Group at 866-539-1100 for earned income tax information.

Make sure all utility bills (phone, water, sewer, electricity, cable, etc.) are current.

Backflow prevention devices must be installed on all waterlines prior to final reading. Depending on where you live in the Township you should contact either Fox Chapel Authority at 412-963-0212 or Hampton Shaler Water Authority at 412-486-4867 for further details.

Township Code Chapter 358, Article V requires that a Sanitary Sewer Certificate be obtained prior to the sale or transfer of property.

A Sanitary Sewer Certificate is issued after the Township and a registered plumber perform an inspection verifying that no storm, ground or surface water is directed into the sanitary sewer system. Property owners arrange and pay for a registered plumber to attend the test. The Township witnesses, inspects and certifies the test at a cost of \$100 for residential buildings and \$200 - \$400 for commercial buildings based on square footage.

Once issued, the Certificate is valid for one year from the date of the initial inspection. It is advisable to have the test done early in the sale process, since repairs **must** be made prior to closing.

Real Estate Tax Rebates

On December 13, 2022 O'Hara Township Council adopted Ordinance No. 1405 establishing a real estate tax rebate program for senior citizens.

If you are age 60 or older, have lived in the Township for ten years or more, have an annual income of less than \$30,000 and your Township real estate taxes increased in 2023, you may be eligible for a real estate tax rebate. The rebate equals 25% of the increase in 2023 Township real estate taxes over 2022 Township real estate taxes.
