Bulk Waste Collection

Waste Management will collect one bulk item once a month at no additional charge on Thursday of the first full week of each month. The remaining collection dates for 2024 are: April 4; May 9; June 6; Friday, July 5; August 8; Friday, September 6; October 10; November 7 and December 5. Additional items can be collected for a fee by calling Waste Management at 800-451-3060.

What is a bulk item? A bulk item is an appliance (washer, dryer, etc.), piece of furniture (chair, table, mattress, etc.), carpeting (cut and taped in 4-foot bundles), an unassembled swing set, basketball board, a pool (less than 6' in height) or other residential items that are too large for a container.

Construction debris such as concrete, brick, asphalt, roofing, dry wall, wood, plaster, vehicles and parts, electronics and hazardous waste are not permitted as bulk items.

Road Improvement Program

Bids were opened on Monday, March 18 for the milling and resurfacing portion of the Township's 2024 annual road improvement program. The Township will once again bid with Fox Chapel Borough.

Recreational Fire Permits



This is a reminder to all residents who like to sit around the campfire roasting marshmallows and telling ghost stories. Don't forget to get your recreational fire permit from the Township for 2024. There is no fee for this permit. The form is available at www.ohara.pa.us under Documents & Forms or at the Township office.

WM Yard Waste Collection

The Township's trash collection contract with Waste Management provides for curbside collection of yard waste on one Wednesday each month from April - August and October and November.

The following Wednesdays are scheduled as collection days for 2024 - May 22, June 19, July 17, August 21, October 23 and November 20.

Residents must call 412-784-1784, ext 203 or email WMYardWaste@ohara.pa.us at least ten (10) days prior to each scheduled date to request collection. Anyone who fails to notify the Township in time to be put on the list will not qualify for collection that month.

Yard waste includes leaves in biodegradable bags, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, limbs, twigs, brush, tree trimmings and similar material, but **NOT** grass clippings. All tree trimmings and limbs must be cut in lengths less than 48" and limbs must be less than 3" in diameter. All material must be securely bundled and each bundle must weigh less than 40 lbs.

The Township continues to provide Spring and Fall Leaf and Brush Collection. For more information on the Fall 2024 leaf and brush collection, please check the Summer Newsletter or the Township website at www.ohara.pa.us.

Attention Archery Hunters

Tryouts for the deer management program in O'Hara Township, run in conjunction with Whitetail Management Associates, will be held on Sunday, May 5 starting at 9:00 am at the Northside Sportsman's Association in Warrendale, PA.

If interested in becoming a hunter, you *must* call the Police Department at 412-782-1403 for further information and mandatory program requirements.

Residents who have problems with deer and own more than one (1) acre may be eligible to have a hunter on their property. If you would like to request a hunter for your property, please contact the Police Department at 412-782-1403.

Recreational Vehicles

Township Code Chapter 455, Article XIV, Section 14.6.C addresses recreational vehicles in residential areas. The Code allows for one recreational vehicle 25' or less in length to be parked in a driveway with a permit issued by the Township. The permit is valid from the Sunday before Memorial Day to the Saturday after Labor Day.

Spring Stormwater Tips

Lawn Watering

A lawn needs just one inch of water per week to be green. If you are watering more than that, a lot of that water is running off into the nearest waterway, taking your fertilizer with it. Adjust your sprinklers so they don't water the driveway or sidewalk. Even better, use drip irrigation or soaker hoses.

Lawn Chemicals and Fertilizer

Read the label before you apply fertilizer or chemicals to your lawn. If you use too much fertilizer, the excess will just wash away in the next rain, polluting our local waterways. Use fertilizers and chemicals sparingly and sweep up excess on driveways, sidewalks, walkways and roads.

Soak Up the Rain!

Rainwater won't become stormwater pollution if you keep it on your property! You can do that by connecting rain barrels to your gutters and using the water they capture in your lawn or garden later. If you are renovating, consider a rain garden or modern "pervious" pavers that allow water to soak through into the soil below. You may be able to get a discount on your Stormwater Utility fee by using these methods. Spring Safety Tips

With Punxsutawney Phil predicting an early spring this year, many of us will be out enjoying the warmer weather. Please be considerate of your neighbors and keep your speed at or under the posted speed limit to protect your neighbors. Remember, residential speed limits are set by the state. The Police Department routinely sees an uptick in speeding complaints in the spring. Please remember residential speed limits are 25 mph unless officially posted otherwise.

When enjoying the nice weather ahead, make sure you are keeping safety in mind. Please make sure when you are out and about whether enjoying our beautiful parks, bike trails or shopping that you are locking your vehicle doors and hiding any valuables such as purses, computer bags or brief cases in the trunk of the vehicle where the items cannot be seen.

Always be mindful of your surroundings. If something does not feel right, listen to your instincts, and quickly react to ensure your safety. When possible, consider walking, running or biking in groups, especially when in secluded areas.

As we begin opening windows and doors to enjoy the fresh air, be mindful of securing your residence whether you are home or not. Keep first floor windows and screen doors locked.

Recycling at the Township Building

Along with our robust curbside recycling program and our household hazardous waste recycling program offered by Waste Management, there are recycling opportunities at the municipal building. The Township offers both glass and corrugated cardboard recycling in our parking lot. Even though both items can be recycled with curbside pickup, you can also use the bins in our lot.

During business hours (8:00 am - 4:30 pm), you can recycle batteries in our lobby. The batteries must have all poles (ends) taped using clear packing tape and be deposited in the appropriately labeled battery bucket.

Also available is a bin where you can deposit American flags to be properly retired by Etna Cub Scout Pack #678.

We are planning to bring back our popular holiday light recycling program in the Fall.

Why Pay a Stormwater Utility Fee

We frequently get asked why do we pay a Stormwater Utility fee. This fee covers maintenance costs and capital projects related to our stormwater system. Since the institution of the fee in Fall of 2020 the Township has constructed:

- 1. Gamma Drive Stormwater Pond
- 2. Epsilon Drive Stormwater Pond
- 3. Greyfriar Drive Stormwater Pond

The existing Alpha Drive stormwater pond was retrofitted to hold back more water than it did previously.

Gamma, Epsilon and Alpha Drive stormwater ponds help hold back approximately six inches of water from Sycamore Run in a large rain event.

Scheduled for construction in 2024 is a stormwater pond on Grove Street. Also scheduled for construction is a stormwater pond in Woodland Park. These ponds coupled with the Greyfriar Drive stormwater pond will help reduce stormwater that runs down Kittanning Pike in large rain events.

Other stormwater pond locations are being reviewed and designs started to continue to reduce flooding in large rain events.

By paying the utility fee our existing stormwater system is maintained and new stormwater ponds can be constructed.

Water Deduct Meters

Summer is coming and if you are planning the installation of a swimming pool or a new irrigation system, you may want to consider installing a water deduct meter. This meter will deduct any water usage for these items from the sewer portion of your water and sewer bill. Without a deduct meter, you will be charged sewage fees on all of the water used even if it doesn't go down the sewer.

Real Estate Tax Rebates

On December 12, 2023 O'Hara Township Council adopted Ordinance No. 1418 establishing a real estate tax rebate program for senior citizens.

If you are age 60 or older, have lived in the Township for ten years or more, have an annual income of less than \$30,000 and your Township real estate taxes increased in 2024, you may be eligible for a real estate tax rebate. The rebate equals 25% of the increase in 2024 Township real estate taxes over 2023 Township real estate taxes.
