#### V. New Business

- A. Ordinances Introduction for First Reading
  - (1) <u>B-4-2023</u>: Amending and Restating the Township Nuisance Ordinance (a)

Each year staff reviews ordinances that may need updated. Staff reviewed the current Nuisance Ordinance and has recommended further clarifications in the ordinance. Definitions of 'compost', 'composting' and 'odor' have been included; updates concerning garbage storage containers relative to the new trash collection contract; and odor emanating from a property. If acceptable, a motion will be needed to introduce ordinance Bill No. B-4-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a voice vote.

(2) <u>B-5-2023</u>: Amending and Restating the Township Solid Waste Storage, Collection and Disposal Ordinance (a)

As a result of changes in the manner trash will be collected based on the new contract with Waste Management, staff reviewed the Solid Waste Storage, Collection and Disposal ordinance and has recommended updates to correlate to the new contract. If acceptable, a motion will be needed to introduce ordinance Bill No. B-5-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a voice vote.

- B. Resolutions
  - (1) <u>B-6-2023</u>: Authorizing Township Participation in the State Road Salt Contract (a)

Staff has recommended the Township continue to participate in the Pennsylvania Department of General Services ("DGS") sodium chloride (road salt) contract. The Township also shares a road salt contract with the North Hills Council of Governments in order to maximize cost savings and ensure needed tonnage and delivery requirements are met. A new Salt Contract Participation Agreement for the upcoming 2023-2024 winter season must be executed and submitted to DGS by March 15, 2023. If acceptable, a motion will be needed to approve resolution Bill No. B-6-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a roll call vote.

(2) <u>B-7-2023</u>: Authoring the Filing of a Grant Application with Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the Meadow Park Tennis Court Improvements (a)

The resolution authorizes the filing of a DCNR Grant Application for the Meadow Park tennis courts in the amount of \$125,000. The Capital Improvement Plan includes the replacement of the existing tennis courts, including new asphalt, coatings, nets and fencing. If acceptable, a motion will be needed to approve resolution Bill No. B-7-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a **roll call vote**.

(3) <u>B-8-2023</u>: Naming Lauri Ann West Community Center as a Township Recreation Partner (a)

Representatives of the Lauri Ann West Community Center have requested the Township's partnership to provide summer programs in Township parks in 2023. If acceptable, a motion will be needed to approve resolution Bill No. B-8-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a **roll call vote**.

(4) <u>B-9-2023</u>: Naming Cooper Siegel Library as a Township Recreation Partner (a)

Representatives of the Cooper Siegel Library have requested the Township's partnership to provide summer programs in Township parks in 2023. If acceptable, a <u>motion</u> will be needed to approve resolution Bill No. B-9-2023 followed by a second to the motion and a **roll call vote**.

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF O'HARA AMENDING AND RESTATING THE TOWNSHIP NUISANCE ORDINANCE NO. 1378

WHEREAS, the Township of O'Hara has undertaken a review of its exist in Nuisance Ordinance No. 1378; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that certain changes should by a corporation into said Ordinance by way of an amendment and restatement for the purpos of landcation and enforceability.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Township of O'Hara harby ards that the Nuisance Ordinance No. 1378 of the Township is hereby amended and research tits entirety.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Township of O'Hara, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

# ARTICLE PURPOSE

#### General

Title. These regulations shall be own to be Nuisance Ordinance of the Township of O'Hara, hereinafter referred to as "this or year."

**Scope**. The provisions are ordinance shall apply to all residential and non-residential properties, vacant land, and constitute its minimum requirements and standards to prohibit nuisances, protect the life, safety, and small we have of the public, and provide for the enforcement and penalties as provided here

#### ARTICLE II DEFINITIONS

Unless otherwise expressly stated, the following terms shall, for the purpose of this ordinance, have the meanings shown in this ordinance.

<u>Compost</u>. A mixture of plant, food waste, organic materials and manure used as plant fertilizer to improve soil properties.

<u>Composting</u>. A controlled, aerobic (oxygen-required) process that converts organic materials into a nutrient-rich soil amendment or mulch through natural decomposition.

Condemn. To adjudge unfit for occupancy.

### **Dangerous Conditions**

- 1. Open wells and cisterns
- 2. Open excavations
- 3. Dangerous placement of refrigerators and other such materials see ipper
- 4. Damaged or partially destroyed buildings or structures in a confidence of a pair
- 5. Unfinished buildings and open foundations for a period exceeding six months.

<u>Debris</u>. The scattered remains of something broken or destroyed; rains; nobbe fragments.

<u>Disorderly Conduct</u>. Any act or conduct causing a disturbance of the code and good order of the Township, including but not limited to, any loud, boilt ous, to ssive, unnecessary noise; fighting; quarreling; public use of obscene or indecent language causing any danger; being visibly intoxicated; loitering or prowling on private or public roverty.

Exterior Property. The open space on the premises and owners or operators of such premises.

Extermination. The control and elemention of insects, rats or other pests by eliminating their harborage places; by removing or making inaccessible materials that serve as their food; by poison spraying, fumigating, trapping any control any control pest elimination methods.

<u>Fireworks.</u> Any combatible of remosive composition or any substance or combination of substances intended to the vice visible and/or audible effects by combustion.

Garbage. The annual vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption and

Rubbish. Con stible and noncombustible waste materials, except garbage; the term shall include the residue from u runing of wood, coal, coke and other combustible materials; paper, rags, d, excelsior, rubber, leather, tree branches, yard trimmings, tin cans, "junk", eral matter, glass, crockery, dust and other similar materials. debris,

person, corporation, partnership or group, whether or not the legal owner of record, a building or portion thereof as a unit.

Terms defined in other codes. Where terms are not defined in this ordinance and are defined in other codes adopted by the Township of O'Hara, such terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them as in those codes.

Terms not defined. Where terms are not defined through the methods authorized by this section, such terms shall have ordinarily accepted meanings such as the context implies.

<u>Weeds</u>. Grasses, annual plants and vegetation. Weeds shall not include cultivated flowers, gardens, ornamental grasses, trees, shrubs, or ivy.

<u>Yard</u>. An open space on the same lot with a structure.

<u>Yard Waste</u>. Grasses, plants, vegetation, leaves, branches, and/or brush that are dead and are no longer rooted in the earth.

# ARTICLE III VIOLATIONS

## **Specific Acts**

### 301.1 Disorderly Conduct

Any individual whose actions or conduct causes a disturbance of the ce and good order of the Township, including but not limited to, any loud, boilt push to ssive, unnecessary noise; fighting; quarreling; public use of obscene or indecent language causing any danger; being visibly intoxicated; loitering or prowling on private or public to perty, hore specifically as follows:

#### A. Noise

- Loud playing of radios, television sets, amplifiers and sound devices so as to be heard beyond the present in a residential neighborhood shall not exceed sixty (60) dba for a two (2) hour due tion nor after 11:00 p.m.; in a commercial area shall not exceed sixty-five the dba for more than eight (8) hours in a twenty-four (24) hour period nor after 1. We am, in an industrial area shall not exceed seventy-five (75) dba for eight (8) hour charing a twenty-four (24) hour period nor after 11:00 p.m.
- 2. Operation of motor vehicles, motorcycles, motorbikes, all-terrain vehicles, scott and go-karts which are not adequately and properly equipped with offile in operating condition, or to operate same causing unnecessary noise an adargerous manner. No gasoline powered lawn equipment, off-road vehicles, reasoline powered chain saw shall be operated any day before 7:00 A.M. nor after 9:00 P.M., nor on Sunday before 12:00 P.M. (Noon), unless being utilized for snow removal or emergency measures.
  - Operating an unlicensed vehicle, including but not limited to, go-karts, all-terrain vehicles, motor bikes, or operating model airplanes equipped with gasoline engines on a public street or on public or school grounds.
- 4. The keeping or harboring of any dog or other animal or fowls which by frequent howling or barking or other noise or odor shall annoy or disturb the neighborhood or a number of persons.

No individual, firm, corporation, or commercial operator shall conduct any building or road construction, excavating, trenching activities, or operation of heavy equipment or trucks in connection therewith between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. daily, or on Sundays or holidays, except by special permission issued by the Township Manager. Such permit shall be issued only if it is shown that the construction work must proceed as a matter of emergency, or that it can be carried on in a manner or in such a place that the public or residents will not be annoyed or disturbed by said construction work. Construction work shall be conducted in such a manner as to avoid or minimize the causing of dirt and a set to be arried by wind onto adjacent properties, or mud to be tracked or define or extreets adjacent to the project.

Exception: The emergency repair of broken at lines, sewer lines or other utilities shall not be subject to be above time restrictions.

6. On any given day, no person shall engage in the string off of fireworks before 12:00 p.m. or after 10:00 p.m.

Exception: Notwithstanding at for going, the setting off of fireworks shall also be permitted during the cells ving time periods: (1) December 31st from 12:00 p.m. until 11:59 p.m. and J. C. y 1st from 12:00 a.m. until 12:30 a.m.; and (2) July 4th from 12:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m.

#### B. Disturbance

- 1. Parking of autor celes the eets or public property or on private property not owned by occupation the automobile for the purpose of engaging in lewd acts.
- 2. No velocubat is disabled, and/or from which the wheels or engine have been removed, and or that is not in operating condition, and/or which does not have a current otor vehicle license, and/or which does not have a current safety sticker tache and/or any vehicle in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, and/or in the possible being stripped and/or dismantled shall be placed, parked, or stored on an arreet, right-of-way, or in any yard, driveway, or on public property for a period act of exceed 48 hours in any one month, as further set forth in Township Zoning Ordinance No. 10911361, Article XVIII, Section 72455-183.87. The above regulations shall not apply to the temporary, minor repair of a vehicle by an owner or occupant of property for a period not to exceed 48 hours in any one month.

Exception: Subject to other regulations, a vehicle is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including bodywork, provided that such work is performed inside a structure or enclosed area.

#### B. Structures

1. Unfinished and unser baildings, foundations or other structures for a period not to exceed the pear, without minimum safeguards to protect and warn occupants and the cheral polic of danger, including but not limited to, fire, faulty construction, damage partial destruction, dilapidated construction, unstable foundation, or ossible ollapse.

## C. Jay Jairs, Parking Spaces, Driveways

- All sidewalks, walkways, stairs, driveways, parking spaces, public parking lots and similar areas shall be maintained free from hazardous conditions, enough for emergency personnel to access premises. Such hazardous conditions include but are not limited to, the accumulation of snow and ice, uneven concrete or bricks which may cause tripping. The owner or occupant thereof shall, within twelve (12) hours after the snow has ceased to fall, remove snow and ice from public sidewalks, walkways, or stairs. No snow or ice shall be deposited or shoveled onto the pavement of any public street.
- 2. Trees, vegetation or other obstructions along roadways or at intersections shall not cover, block or otherwise obstruct sight lines of traffic or traffic signs or signals.

### D. Swimming Pools

1. Any above ground or on-ground swimming pool that is greater than three feet (3') deep shall have an enclosure of not less than four (4) feet above the ground and shall conform to the requirements as stipulated in the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code. Any pool, associated appurtenance and electrical equipment shall be maintained in good condition, free from stagnant water, and shall be inspected and approved by the Township.

#### E. <u>Miscellaneous</u>

In the interest of the public health, safety and welfare conditions and a way one shall be prohibited, including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. The placement of refrigerators, freezers and older such a cerials or equipment, which potentially poses a threat to health and sates a bluding but not limited to suffocation, injury or deterioration.
- 2. The keeping of a vicious dog not ad the teached or secured.

#### 301.3 Health Concerns

In accordance with Allegheny County Health Cepartment regulations, as may hereinafter be amended, and is on file at the Town of O Hara for review during regular business hours, it shall be unlawful for any person to take him or permit any of the following conditions that could cause serious life-threatening him in the Township of O'Hara, including but not limited to:

#### A. Water

- 1. Swhere g pools which are three (3) feet in depth or greater and not properly fegure led with guards or fences. All electric components shall be in good provider and properly inspected.
  - nant water in which insects multiply.

# B. <u>h</u> station/Sanitation

- The infestation of insects, rats, vermin or other pests. The owner shall be responsible for promptly exterminating rodents found by approved processes that will not be injurious to human health. After extermination, proper precautions shall be taken by the owner to eliminate rodent harborage and prevent re-infestation.
- 2. All exterior property, vacant land and premises not kept free of rubbish, garbage and debris.

- a. The occupant or owner of any premises within the Township shall provide obtain from the Township's Collector, and maintain in good order portable garbage and rubbish containers for the storage of all garbage and rubbish accumulated on said premises, equipped with handles and tightly fitted with lids, whose capacity shall not exceed forty (40) gallons.
- b. No person shall cause or allow any garbage or rubbish or dead animals to be deposited on any street or public or private property.
- c. It shall be the duty of every owner, tenant or occupants of any parenty in the Township to keep exterior property, vacant lands at order to free from rubbish, garbage or dead animals which might become as tenace to health, or an offensive sight or odor to residents of the towns.
- d. No person shall place, throw or deposit carbage, case, waste, rubbish, papers, or decaying plant, animal or veget by caster of any kind, including tree or plant cuttings, upon or along any search highway, or upon public property, or along the bank of any team or watercourse within the Township.
  - i. Nothing in the foregoir coall prohibit a person from properly maintaining a compost pive upon property owned or occupied by them on which way be thrown leaves, lawn clippings, garden trimmer food waste, organic materials and manure, so long as a nuitain estall not result there from.

#### C. Odors

- 1. No per a coall manufacture, create or maintain any continuous or repeated odor or soull when is offensive, obnoxious, troublesome, annoying or unpleasant emanting from a property and is likely to interfere with the ordinary enjoyment of other panerty in the vicinity.

- The growing or cultivation of noxious weeds as established under the noxious weed control list pursuant to Section 255.3(b) of the Pennsylvania Noxious Weed Control Law (3 P.S. 255.1 255.11).
- 2. Properties in developed neighborhoods shall be maintained substantially free of noxious weeds, grass or similar plant growth in excess of 10 inches in height or until such plant goes to seed.

Exception: Wooded lots.

#### 301.4 Interest of Public Safety

In the interest of public safety, the following provisions shall be adhered to so not to pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare.

- 1. Roof water, French drains, and property run off shall not be discharged onto streets or sidewalks or in a manner that creates a hazardous condition. Newly constructed storm water facilities cannot cause damage to adjacent property in act of lance with the Township Stormwater Management Ordinance.
- 2. It is prohibited, including without limitation in accordance was guidelines established by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, place or allow any object to remain (including without limitation, transportation) and of prevent persons operating motorized and non-motorized vehicles appulies tests from obtaining a clear view of traffic, pedestrians, or bicyclists, or allow according to those utilizing any street or siturally any such obstruction shall be removed by the owner or occupant of the presents on which the obstruction is located, or by the owner or operators may obstructing vehicle located on a public street.
- 3. Areas of a public or utility easement and/or right-of-way shall be maintained by owner of such premises, property of vacant land.

Exceptions to course of a utility provider maintaining said utility appurtences, the exsement/right-of-way shall be restored by utility provider to a not on equal to the condition prior to maintenance work. Utility provider to hall not be responsible for replacing trees or shrubs planted easement or right-of-way.

4. It should unlawful for any dirt, mud, soil, stone or debris to be washed, tracked or deposited upon the pavement of any street. Any dirt, mud, soil, stone or deposited upon the pavement of any street shall be completely removed be de 5:00 p.m. of the same day. Preventative control measures and intermediate a lings may be deemed necessary by the Township.

# 30. B ning, Open Fires

- Y. No person shall cause to be emitted into the open air from any open fire excessive smoke, excessive odor or malodorous emissions of which conflicts with the provisions of the Allegheny County Smoke Control Law.
- 2. Open burning shall be deemed allowed for the sole purpose of recreation, camping, or cooking on private property only.

- 3. Open burning shall be allowed upon inspection and issuance of a Recreational Fire Permit by the Township Fire Marshal, Code Official or Township Manager.
- 4. The Recreational Fire Permit Holder shall notify the O'Hara Township Police Secretary or voice mail system of the intended recreational fire a minimum of one hour prior to igniting the open fire.
- 5. Open burning shall be permitted within a permanent fire circle in place or commercial fire pit.
- 6. Only dry, clean wood products or other clean-burning are are onitted for opening burning.
- 7. Only smokeless fuels, if any, are permitted to ignite be on 1 fre.
- 8. The pile of material being burned may not exceed in (2) feet in height.
- 9. The open fire must be at least ten feet from the nearest structure, inhabited area, roadway, property line or utility.
- 10. Portable outdoor fireplaces must be tea (10) feet from the nearest structure, dwelling, roadway, property line, utility.
- 11. The open fire must be attracted at all times until the open fire is extinguished.
- 12. Adequate means a control and extinguish the open fire shall be readily available at all time suring as tearning.
- 13. A class 4A fine extinguisher or garden hose shall be located close to the fire.
- 14. Thalk sunlawful for any person or persons to light or ignite, within the Township to the Township on public or private land, brush, wood, grass, or material of any nature, the aring of which necessitates the attendance of the Township Volunteer Fire artment or Departments and/or any other Fire Department or Departments.

# ARTICLE IV NOTICES AND ORDERS OF VIOLATION

# 401.1 Notice to Owner or to Person or Persons Responsible

Whenever a violation of this ordinance has been determined to have occurred, notice shall be given to the owner of record of the parcel on which the violation has occurred and/or the person or persons responsible for maintaining said property, vacant land or premises in the manner prescribed below:

- 1. Reasonable efforts to make personal contact via in-person visit or telephone call.
- 2. Be in writing.
- 3. Include a description of the real estate sufficient for identification.
- 4. Include a statement of the violation or violations and why the notice is being issued.
- 5. Include a correction order allowing a reasonable time based on severity of the problem to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.
- 6. Include citation of ordinance violated and respective section and a section.

#### 401.2 Delivery of Notice or Order

Such notice or order shall be deemed to be properly delivered if

- 1. Delivered personally; or
- 2. Sent by certified or first-class mail addresses to the last known address; or
- 3. If the notice is returned showing that the letter was not delivered, a copy thereof shall be posted in a conspicuous face in, on or about premises affected by such notice.

### 401.3 Transfer of Ownership

Upon receipt of a notice of violatin by the owner or individual responsible for maintaining property, it shall be until the last of said person to sell, transfer, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of such property to other:

- 1. til h. provisions of the violation(s) has/have been complied with; or
  - Use such owner shall furnish to the Township a signed and notarized statement the grantee, transferee, mortgagee, or lessee, acknowledging the receipt of such notice of violation and fully accepting the responsibility without condition for making the corrections or repairs required.

#### 401.4 Failure to Comply

Any person failing to comply with a notice of violation will be subject to fine and/or civil suit under Article VI.

# ARTICLE V EMERGENCY MEASURES

#### **501.1 Imminent Danger**

### ARTICLE VI PENALTY

## 601.1 Causes of Action

In case any person, partnership or corporation who or which has violated or permitted the violation of any provision of this ordinance, the Township may institute any appropriate legal action or proceeding to prevent, restrain, correct or abate such violation, or to prevent illegal occupancy of a building, structure or premises, or to stop an illegal act, conduct business or utilization of the building, structure or premises.

#### 601.2 Fine

Any person who violates or permits a violation of this chapter shall, upon conviction in a summary proceeding brought before a Magisterial District Judge under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, be guilty of a summary offense and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000, plus costs of prosecution. 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# TOWNSHIP OF O'HARA ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF O'HARA REGULATING THE STORAGE, COLLECTION, AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE; REPEALING AND RESTATING ORDINANCE NO. 1268 IN ITS ENTIRETY; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Township of O'Hara has undertaken a review of its a song Solid Vaste Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority vested in the Townshi Div to Ponsylvania Solid Waste Management Act 97 of 1980, as amended, the Council of the Township of O'Hara is desirous of updating the Ordinance regulating the storage, collection, addisposal of garbage, rubbish, and refuse in the Township.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTH by Council of the Township of O'Hara, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

#### SECTION I: SHORT TITLE

The short title of this Ordinance wall be the "Township of O'Hara Solid Waste Ordinance", and the same may be cited in Sat Janner.

#### SECTION II: REPEAL ANCES

# SECTION III: POFINE ONS

<u>Collection Container</u> - a receptacle provided by the Township's Collections for the comporary storage of solid waste while awaiting collection that is rodent and in the first container.

<u>Collector</u> - the entity or entities authorized by the Township to collect soll prote from residences, or authorized by multi-family rental housing properties, or commercial and institutional establishments that do not receive collection services from the Township to collect solid waste from those establishments.

<u>Commingled</u> – recyclable glass, aluminum, meaning ns, plastics and papers mixed together or combined into one container.

<u>Commercial Establishments</u> - those properties used primarily for commercial and industrial purposes, including, but not limited estores, markets, office buildings, restaurants, shopping centers, theaters, factories, foundies mills, processing plants, refineries, mines, and slaughterhouses.

Commercial Solid Waste I solid as generated by commercial and industrial businesses.

Construction and Described Waste - all waste building materials, grubbing waste, and rubble resulting from construction, readeling, repair, and demolition operations on houses, commercial buildings, and other sectures and pavements.

- B. Council may at any time establish fees for the collection of residential solid waste from residences to be paid to the Township by persons requiring such service.
- C. The Township's collector and any other licensed collectors shall be as, insible or the collection of any fees for private arrangement or private contract solid waste collection and disposal services provided to any individual, residential, competial, estitutional source located within the Township.

#### SECTION VIII: ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS

All appeals from the provisions contained in this Ordina central be made to the Township Manager in writing.

### SECTION IX: INJUNCTION POWERS


