It has been proposed by International Testing Laboratory Services owner of the property located at 635 Alpha Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15238, to construct a 3,136 square foot storage building. The Township Planning Commission has recommended to Council that approval be granted subject to the six conditions listed in the attached proposed resolution.
