Vice President Vogel requested a moment of silence to remember the individuals that sacrificed their lives that fateful day.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS CONCERNING AN APPLICATION FOR CONDITIONAL USE APPROVAL FROM SQF, LLC FOR WIRELESS COMMUNICATION FACILITIES

Manager Jakubec stated the purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive public comments concerning an application for Conditional Use approval submitted by SQF, LLC to install two additional antennae on existing utility poles owned by Verizon Communication and Duquesne Light Company located along Old Freeport Road. She noted the antennae will be two to three feet in size and will be painted to blend in with the utility pole.

Mr. Mark Kulik was in attendance representing SQF, LLC, which is a Public Utility Commission regulated entity. The antennae are being installed on behalf of Verizon Wireless Communications.

He confirmed that the antennae would be painted to match the utility pole. One antenna is cylindrical and two-feet in height; the other antenna is a side-mount as required by Duquesne Light Company. He noted each power company has a different approach.

There were no questions or comments.

Motion by Mr. Denny, Jr. to adjourn the Public Hearing was seconded by Mr. Stewart and carried unanimously. The Public Hearing adjourned at 7:08 p.m. and Council proceeded directly into the regular meeting.
